# Learning from the Past/Creating a New Future... The Legacy of KRISTALLNACHT

With Dr. Martina Emme

Sunday, Nov 6 10:30am - 12:00pm Location: Zoom



Dr. Emme will be joining us from her home in Berlin. She is Head of the Department of Psychology at Anna-Freud high school in Berlin, Germany and co-author of the One-by-One book *Journeys of Transformation: Confronting the Legacies of Conflict, War and Genocide*.

She will share her journey coming from the country of perpetrators, born into a family with Nazi-believers including her own beloved grandfather who was involved in Nazi-crimes. She will describe how the life-changing encounters with descendants of survivors led her to become a teacher who sees her task as educating the next generation about the lessons learned from the Holocaust. Dr. Emme will talk about the projects she has initiated and share her vision: becoming guardians for protecting democracy.

**Dr. Martina Emme** is a trauma pedagogue and Head of the Department of Psychology at Anna Freud High School in Berlin, Germany where she teaches Psychology and Pedagogy. She has initiated the GeDenktag/remembering the Shoah (January 27<sup>th</sup> Memorial Day) at the school. She is a member of the Cooperative Project between the Berlin Senate and the International School for Holocaust Studies at Yad Vashem and is involved in creating projects dedicated to the prevention of antisemitism. She also serves as a group psychoanalyst for rabbinical and cantorial students at the Abraham Geiger Kolleg in Potsdam, Germany.

Kerem Shalom is honored to host Yehudi Wyner who will be discussing and performing his music for us. Mr. Wyner has composed over 100 works for orchestra, chamber ensemble, chorus, solo



performers, theater, and settings of Jewish liturgy. He has performed as a solo pianist and chamber musician, directed two opera companies, and taught at Yale, Harvard, Cornell, SUNY Purchase, Brandeis, and the Tanglewood Music Center and has been President of the American Academy of Arts and Letters. His many honors and awards include a Pulitzer Prize in music, two Guggenheim fellowships, the Brandeis Creative Arts Award, and a Grammy.

In awarding Mr. Wyner a Gold Medal for Music in 2021, the American Academy of Arts and Letters described him as "a true ambassador in the belief that the history of civilization is written in art whose creation and appreciation is universal across continents, cultures, and languages."

Mr. Wyner will speak about growing up in a musical household with a father who was a renowned composer of Yiddish art songs and Jewish liturgical music, the influence Judaism has had on his compositions, and how he composes. He will be playing selections of his music as well.



# With Brandeis Professor Emeritus Stephen Whitfield

Get ready for another extraordinary talk from Steve Whitfield. We're delighted to welcome him again as a featured speaker for our L.E.D series.

Professor Whitfield taught American Studies at Brandeis University from 1972-2017 and is now Brandeis Professor Emeritus. He has won a number of major teaching awards and is the author of ten books on twentieth century American history and on American Jewish history. Over the years, he has shared his insights on many topics with Kerem Shalom members, including politics, culture, music, and Jewish history.

Steve's will focus his talk on the critical role of Jewish lawyers in the civil rights movement during the 1960s. In Professor Whitfield's words:

"The quest for racial justice in the United States has been a constant struggle, with successes and failures, triumphs and limitations. One clear historic victory consists of the extinction of legally-sanctioned white supremacy in the South, a campaign that was mounted not only in the streets but also in the courtroom. In the early 1960s, a few hundred attorneys came from outside the region to apply their professional skills, taking risks and courting danger -- out of an idealistic desire to make America more democratic. Nearly all of these lawyers were white; nearly all of them were Jews. What they managed to accomplish has never been adequately told. The presentation at Kerem Shalom on December is intended to offer a partial remedy."

What is prayer? Why do we pray? What are we saying when we mouth all those familiar (and some not-so-familiar) Hebrew words? Why these particular words and not others that might be more personally meaningful? Is there an intentional structure to our prayer book, and if so, why is it so hard to see? How do we keep the words we utter fresh, and meaningful, conveying the essence of our souls? How do we keep our prayer from becoming an exercise in rote recitation, using words empty of intention and meaning?

We will tackle these questions and many others as we learn about our prayer book (siddur). Using the prayers of Kabbalat Shabbat (Friday night services) as our source text, we will explore the arc of the spiritual journey our siddur hopes to take us through. We will delve into the history of the siddur, and note the similarities between the Friday night service and every other service in Jewish liturgy.

Judah Ha-Levi, the great 11th century poet said, "Prayer is to the soul what food is to the body". Our goal will be to make your experience of prayer more meaningful, to make it nourishing to your soul, a true conversation with God.

# **Diverse Cultures of Contemporary Israel:**Exploring A Multiplicity of Identities Through Story And Film

#### With Dr Jacob Meskin

A multi- session series on Tuesday mornings

First session: Jan 17 Location: Zoom

For a variety of reasons most American Jews have learned more about the history of modern Israel, but less about the full complexity of all the different cultures that make up contemporary Israeli society. This course will help participants grasp how that history actually gets lived out in the day-to-day life of a sprawling, vibrant, deeply multi-cultural, and multi-religious society. Drawing on popular media, such as films, short stories, Israeli sketch-comedy television shows, and especially popular music

videos (all in translation), and also taking advantage of helpful scholarly literature, this course will explore many facets of the con-temporary diversity of cultural experiences in Israel. Using this multi-media approach, we will be learning about the following cultures, communities, and perspectives:

- Different Jewish cultures (Ashkenazi, Mizrachi, Russian, Ethiopian, etc)
- Israeli Arab cultures (Muslim, Christian, Druze, etc.)
- Palestinian intellectual and cultural perspectives on Palestinian identity and on Israel
- The central roles that food plays in different cultures
- Changing conceptions of gender identity
- LGBTQ identities in Israel
- Relationships between different kinds of religious Jews, and between religious and secular Jews

A great deal of what we will be studying will be drawn from popular culture in Israel. This turns out to be a fascinating and invigorating way to take the pulse of the many cultures and peoples that make up the society.

Students may be asked to watch several films at home, prior to class. This may require access to free and paid streaming services. They will also be asked to screen online videos.





# **Torah Conversations Group**

KS Torah Conversations is an ongoing conversation group that meets each Shabbat morning. No prior knowledge of Torah or Hebrew is required to participate, although attendees are asked to read the week's parasha (Torah portion). The parasha is listed in the KS Weekly News and can be read online at Sefaria. Most participants read English translations.



For the current year, 5783, as a guide for discussion, along with reading the parasha, the group will read the weekly section in <u>The JPS Rashi Discussion Torah Commentary</u>, by Steven and Sarah Levy. Some participants also enjoy reading from a wide range of other commentaries.

Torah Conversations members take turns facilitating the discussion. The conversations typically flow back and forth between trying to understand the embedded meaning of the weekly parasha and connecting it to questions that have relevance in our lives. Each person's voice is welcomed.

Rabbi Sam Pollak, Director of Congregational Learning, serves as our Clergy Advisor and will study with us and facilitate our conversation once a month, on the following dates: 11/12, 12/10, 1/7, 2/11, 3/11, 4/8, 5/13 (Pesach) and 6/10

We meet each Shabbat morning, currently on Zoom. Conversations about the week's parasha begin promptly at 8:45am and end at 9:45am. The room opens ten minutes earlier for general conversation. The group meets weekly, with rare exceptions, as long as there are two or more of us who are available to meet. We welcome you to join us any Shabbat morning.

# **Kerem Shalom Men's Group**

Are you interested in joining or starting a men's group? For over two decades, a small group of men connected with Kerem Shalom have been meeting regularly to witness each other's



challenges, joys, and sorrows. Participants are happy to talk with Kerem Shalom members who might be interested in joining this group or starting a new one.

When this group began, its members were in their late 40s, a challenging, headsdown life stage for many men. Members are now in their 60s and 70s, a life stage with new challenges related to work, health, relationships, and family. The group explores these themes in semi-structured, confidential, and non-judgmental conversations which are "advice-free unless asked." Work, children, partners, the man's "role" as caregiver, and adventures are all grist for this mill. And while this is not a religious study group, religious and spiritual experiences are sometimes discussed.

If there is sufficient interest, members of the current group are more than happy to help a new group get underway, then step back and let that group evolve.

# Animals Can Bring Healing: A Holocaust Survivor and a Kitten

Shmuel was an institutionalized Holocaust survivor from Poland. His traumatic experiences in the concentration camps as a child left him debilitated with severe Post Traumatic Stress Disorder. He barely spoke over the years and when he did, those words were often singular and monosyllabic. Shmuel was particularly fond of a kitten called Chanel. Chanel invariably chose Shmuel's lap as her special place for comfort and security. Shmuel stood up holding Chanel in his arms and gently rested his ear to her body... He was smiling and crying. Struggling, he turned and spoke... in Hebrew.

This was the first time the staff and patients of Animal Therapy at HAMA Israel had ever heard Shmuel speak Hebrew so clearly and coherently. He began to rub his head gently on the cat's shoulders...

this indeed was a moment of grace.

Dogs also offer us loving comfort. The Hebrew word for dog is *kelev* (like heart). Here are three new young members of Kerem Shalom who certainly touch our hearts.
