




## Upcoming Special Events

### **The Miraculous from the Material** **with KS Member Professor Alan Lightman** **and a Rabbinic Response from Rabbi Darby** **An L.E.D. program\***

Over the years, Alan Lightman has provided the Kerem Shalom community with memorable talks about spirituality and science. We are delighted that Alan once again will be sharing his insights with us as part of our L.E.D. series.

Alan's upcoming talk is based on his latest book, *The Miraculous from the Material*. He will introduce his concept of "spiritual materialism," which is a materialist view of the world but one that embraces spiritual experiences. Throughout his remarks, Alan will describe, as well as show, photographs of a number of awe-inducing and beautiful natural phenomena—including rainbows, spider webs, the rings of Saturn, volcanoes, and bioluminescence. He'll explain the science behind these phenomena and, in many cases, his personal experiences with them. If you've heard Alan speak in the past—or read any of his 25 books—you know this will be an illuminating and memorable talk.

Adding to the inspirational quality of this special L.E.D. program, after Alan's talk and slides, Kerem Shalom's Rabbi Darby Leigh will provide a Jewish/rabbinic response to the images and ideas Alan presents. Then Alan and Rabbi Darby will participate in a conversation exploring some of the themes raised in Alan's book, followed by Q&A. Join us for this fascinating program.







# Ancestral Dreaming: Connect with Your Ancestors and Heal Generational Wounds through Dreamwork

Our departed ancestors may connect with us in many forms, often through dreams or waking dream-adjacent states and experiences of “uncanny coincidences” known as synchronicities. They may be letting us know that they are still with us, or that they need something from us, or at times feel threatening as well. Our Jewish history is filled with the importance of connecting with our ancestors and with the strong dreamers in our sacred books.

Dream studies take us on a deep dive into the heart of our healing. They help us to go forward and backwards in time to connect with and to heal our ancestors, and then, along with the dream-guided action steps, pass on the healing rather than the wounds or the trauma to the next generations. This interactive discussion will explore six types of calls from our ancestors, how to respond to each one, and how to honor them and heal across time and space.

Linda will be available, along with her books, following the presentation.

**Linda Yael Schiller, MSW, LICSW** is an international speaker and award-winning author on dreamwork, nightmares, and trauma, and professor emeritus at Boston University School of Social Work and Simmons University post-graduate trauma treatment program. She is the author of *Ancestral Dreaming: Healing Generational Wounds with Dreamwork*, *PTSDreams: Transform Your Nightmares from Trauma through Healing Dreamwork*, *Modern Dreamwork: New Tools for Decoding Your Soul’s Wisdom*, and *Comprehensive and Integrative Trauma Treatment Workbook*, as well as numerous articles and book chapters.

An integrative mind/body/spiritual psychotherapist and consultant with over 40 years’ experience, she is a long-term member of *The International Association for the Study of Dreams*. Linda is also trained in the body/mind methodologies of EMDR, EFT, TAT, HBLU, Kabbalah healing, Enneagram, hypnotherapy, Somatic Experiencing, Focusing, and Reiki.

The Israel conversations planning group just showed *No Other Land*, an Oscar winning documentary about an area of the West Bank that is being cleared of villages to make room for an Israeli tank training ground. The showing was followed by a discussion facilitated by David Hoffman. In addition, we continue to offer conversations about Israel and the greater Middle East once or twice a month facilitated by Dan Terris. These discussions are open to members only.

Our future plans include a presentation by a representative of J Street, which according to its website is a nonprofit liberal Zionist advocacy and lobby group whose aims include strengthening Jewish democracy in Israel, promoting a diplomatic end to the Israeli–Palestinian conflict with a two-state solution, and opposing the Boycott, Divestment and Sanctions movement.







## Kerem Shalom Men's Group

### ***New members invited!***

Are you interested in joining or starting a men's group? For over two decades, a small group of men connected with Kerem Shalom have been meeting regularly to witness each other's challenges, joys, and sorrows. Participants are happy to talk with Kerem Shalom members who might be interested in joining this group or starting a new one.



When this group began, its members were in their late 40s, a challenging, heads-down life stage for many men. Members are now in their 60s and 70s, a life stage with new challenges related to work, health, relationships, and family. The group explores these themes in semi-structured, confidential, and non-judgmental conversations which are "advice-free unless asked." Work, children, partners, the man's "role" as caregiver, and adventures are all grist for this mill. And while this is not a religious study group, religious and spiritual experiences are sometimes discussed.

If there is sufficient interest, members of the current group are more than happy to help a new group get underway, then step back and let that group evolve.
